Regardless of how long it takes for us to navigate our way through COVID-19, I pray that, as individuals and a community, we will find the space and time to heal all that has harmed and hurt whilst carrying forward and building upon all the blessings we have found.

#### The Rector Writes...... And remembers

Gracie Fields famously sang "Wish me luck as you wave me goodbye". I hope that as I leave at the end of this month, we



will go one better and hold each other in our prayers as we wave each other 'goodbye' meaning God Be With You! It will not be an easy thing to leave. You have given me so much in my time with you. You have shared your lives and your stories, your laughter and your tears, and gifted me your time and the benefit of your wisdom and skills. I thank you for this generosity but most of all I thank you for loving me and allowing me to love you.

Ordained ministry is a strange beast. It asks us to love people and then leave them. This is hard for everyone, but it is the way Christ himself worked - he did not stay in one place. You must know by now how much I love stories. I would like to leave you with a story someone wiser than me used to illustrate the nature of the ministry to which I am called and in which you have helped me grow so much:



A man died and left his 17 camels to his 3 sons. The instructions were to divide them according to age. The eldest son was to have half of the camels, the middle son a third of them, and the youngest son a ninth. The sons were troubled because they could not fulfil their father's wishes, the camels could not be split according to his instructions. Their Uncle had an idea. He lent the three brothers his own camel. Now there were eighteen camels. The oldest son took half, nine camels. The next took a third, six camels and the youngest took a ninth and received two camels. And yet there was still a camel left at the end to return to the Uncle.

This eighteenth camel was lent for a time; it enabled the family to do what they needed to do; yet when that task was done, the loaned camel was free to go. It was a part of the work, an important part, but it was not left tied up in it.

Rectors are the eighteenth camel - called to be a part of, to facilitate, to help the work of the church. But the work itself is always God's and has to be that of the whole body of the church - the community that will be there long after the minister has moved on. So, don't get the hump that we have to leave: clergy are valuable, but not indispensable; useful but never the person upon which everything should hang; a part, but only for a time, because the work of God goes on without, and far and way beyond them.

As we welcome the Christ Child yet again into our homes and hearts it is time for this 18<sup>th</sup> camel and 49<sup>th</sup> Rector to wave you a fond goodbye.

I will be praying for you as you journey to find the 'next camel' and will always hold you in my prayers;

And until we meet again, I wish you every joy and blessing.

### **Favourite Things**

Although I am leaving as Rector at the end of this month, I will carry you with me in my heart. I will continue to hold you all in my prayers and I hope we will not lose touch. But I am aware that any sort of change heralds a time of uncertainty which can make us anxious or troubled. In the film 'The Sound of Music' Maria (Julie Andrews) advocates that when something troubles us, we should think of our 'favourite things' and so in this spirit I leave you with a few of mine!

My favourite bible verse - there are so many I could choose but in times of uncertainty and anxiety Exodus 19:4a always comes to me:-

"I carried you on eagles' wings and brought you to myself."

The picture of God protecting and sheltering us beneath his wings is a well-known image in the bible but less so this one of God carrying us on eagles' wings to bring us safely home to him.

I love this idea of movement and journey and being carried safely homeward to God.

My favourite hymn – another difficult decision as there are so many I could choose, and different hymns will resonate in differing situations. I shall cheat here and pick two. First, 'Be Still for the Presence of the Lord' – which I love because every time it calls me back to the power and presence of God and fills me with peace. Second: 'Tell Out My Soul' which is based on the Magnificat that Mary Sings and which reminds me that we too are charged with carrying Christ's love and work out into the world.



My favourite festival – although I love Christmas and need Easter, my favourite festival is Candlemas. It might be that it falls the day before my birthday, but I hope it has more to do with Simeon waiting all those years and then taking the Christ-Child in his arms and singing the most wonderful song of praise: the Nunc Dimittis. What an encouragement for us all.

My favourite psalm – I love the psalms, there is something within them for every emotion and situation but one that I return to frequently is Psalm 51. Tradition has it that this was written by King David after he had sinned greatly by committing adultery with Bathsheba and arranging the death of her husband. It is a psalm of penitence often used on Ash Wednesday but when I feel weary or overwhelmed, I often find myself using v10-12 as a personal prayer: Create in me a pure heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me. Do not cast me from your presence or take your Holy Spirit from me. Restore to me the joy of your salvation and grant me a willing spirit, to sustain me. (Psalm 51 v10-12)

My favourite anthem – "I was Glad" written in 1902 by Hubert Parry for the coronation of Edward VII is majestic and truly beautiful. I love this piece so much that I chose it to walk down the aisle when I married Ian. The lyrics are based on Psalm 122, one of the Psalms of Ascent sung as pilgrims reached Jerusalem. They sing of joy at entering the House of God: "I was glad when they said unto me: ye will go into the house of the Lord".


**My favourite Gospel** – again it is hard to choose. Matthew bridges the Old and New Testament stories so well, Mark is short and easy to read, and John is poetic and full of imagery! But I would choose Luke because he is the ultimate storyteller!

### Reflections on the meaning of 'Words'

Sadly this year because of the restrictions on singing we will not be able to hold a traditional Lessons and Carols service where, through the words of scripture and song, we journey through the bible story that leads to, and explains, the birth of Jesus. This service always culminates with the first 14 verses of John's Gospel which famously begin "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God". In naming Jesus as the Word of God, John attests to both his divinity and purpose in becoming flesh and so the truth that as God incarnate, Jesus is the clearest image of God we have. One of the main ways we communicate is through the use of words, so it makes perfect sense to call Jesus the Word of God. I have always loved 'words' believing they hold immense power, allowing us to make connections, build relationships, weave stories and poetry and make meaning of our lives and world and it has been a privilege whilst Rector to be able to share my words with you. I am thankful to whoever wrote the poem below for being able to express all of this and, like St John, draw attention to the source of all life and words: The Word of God.

#### **Gratitude for Words**

The poetry exercise says to "find 50-100 words you like."

Words in books, notes, brochures, on signs, and rolling off of people's tongues. Words that catch my attention. Words that make me feel . . . something. Words that sound the way they should against my ear.

So I've been looking and listening And, God, there are so many. "Thistle" and "shallow"



"Habitat" and "dragonfly"

"Sweet" and "sharp" and "dusk" and "rest"

Each word signifying something beyond itself;

Each word a way to share the world with other people—including:-
